In 1978, a preacher named Henry Smith wrote a song that I'm sure many of us know well. The song, entitled "Give Thanks," begins like this: "Give thanks with a grateful heart, give thanks to the Holy One... The story goes that while writing this song, Smith was enduring a particularly challenging time in his life. His eyesight was rapidly deteriorating, and he was struggling to find steady work. Among the verses that inspired Smith as he wrote this song were Joel 3:10, Ephesians 5:20, Colossians 3:15-16, and Revelation 2:9. The idea of giving thanks to God in all circumstances - no matter how good or bad - is evident in each of those verses, and throughout Smith's simple yet beautiful song.





During a visit in early January to one of our supporting congregations in the Charleston area, I noted to those in attendance that morning a major accomplishment at Southeastern Children's Home. That accomplishment was this: the SECH campus

was full; each on-campus foster home was maxed out in terms of both licensed foster parents and foster children. This was quite an improvement over where we had been just six months prior as we were officially transitioning into becoming

But Smith's song encourages us to give thanks no matter our circumstances, and the verses that inspired him to write his song echo that sentiment. It's all about gratitude and giving thanks with a grateful heart - in the good times and the bad. Unfortunately, the children we serve at SECH know all about the bad times; many of them have been witnesses to the worst of the worst. They are certainly among those labeled "poor" and "weak" in Smith's song. Fortunately, our staff and our licensed foster parents take very seriously the task of helping the "poor" become "rich," and encouraging the "weak" to be "strong." It is the work we do each and every day, and we are grateful to have the opportunity to do what we do. Thanks be to God for what He has done to bless our ministry at SECH, and thanks be to each of you for the support you provide that helps those who are "poor and weak to become "rich and strong!"

Legacy giving is often referred to as planned giving Planned giving is the process in which someone creates a financial or estate plan in which they formally decide to give something of value to an organization at a future date. There are several ways in which one may leave a legacy gift:

- **Charitable Bequest Bequests** are gifts that are made as part of a will or trust.
- **Marketable Securities -**Marketable securities are financial assets that can be easily bought and sold on a public market, such as stocks, bonds, and mutual funds.
- IRA Distributions If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can give to a charity annually from your IRA as a tax-free rollover gift. These gifts count toward your minimum required distribution but do not count as income.
- **Charitable Gift Annuities -**A charitable gift annuity provides the donor with a fixed income.
