There are plenty of ways that you can help!



In preparation for a recent Sunday morning presentation at one of Southeastern Children's Home's supporting churches, our foster care team put together an information sheet with the tagline, "Everybody Can Do Something." As I spoke that morning, I made sure I emphasized that important phrase to the people listening. Sometimes the need feels too great, too big, too overwhelming and it paralyzes us, causing us to feel stuck and inadequate. Sometimes we just do not know what to do. So, we do nothing.

But by emphasizing that phrase, it was our effort to let everyone in that particular church know that when it comes to meeting the needs of the children and families in the foster care system, it is indeed the case that all people everywhere are capable of helping. It is true for that particular church; it is true for all churches; it is true for you.

Our foster care team's goal is to help inform people that, within the foster care system, there are countless ways for them - for you - to help. Could helping include getting licensed as either an on-campus or off-campus foster parent with SECH? Yes. Could helping mean accepting a foster child or children into your home for a long-term placement? Yes. Could helping look like welcoming a foster child into your home on a short-term or respite



basis, providing a needed overnight or weekend break for licensed foster parents in your church or community? Yes. Could you provide weekly babysitting for a foster child or two so their foster parents can

enjoy dinner together as a couple? Yes. Could it even be providing meals or laundry service or transportation for licensed foster parents? Yes. Yes. Yes!

It's all of these - and then some.

There are plenty of things you can do to help foster children and foster families, so many that I do not have the space in this newsletter to list. Again, everybody can do something.

As an employee of Southeastern Children's Home, I have witnessed firsthand the immense need for foster care families and the critical role that the church plays in meeting that need. Foster care

is a challenging journey, but it does not have to be taken alone. Churches have the unique ability to rally together, providing not just resources, but also the emotional and spiritual support that foster families need. I have seen incredible stories of church communities stepping up. I believe it is time for more churches to rise to the occasion and create foster care communities within their congregations.

One example that stands out is a church in our area that organized a "Foster Care Sunday." On that day, they invited some SECH families fostering children to share their stories. The entire congregation responded with overwhelming support—providing meals, offering to babysit, and even

donating household items. One foster mother shared how the church had become a second family to her, reminding her that she was never alone in her struggles. The church did not just talk about supporting foster families—they put their faith into action, creating a tangible community of care for the families who needed it

At Southeastern Children's Home, we have seen several churches partner with us to ensure that families feel supported. Several churches went beyond the basics and wanted to help a family financially by buying diapers, clothes, and food. That allowed foster families to focus on what mattered most - caring for the children in their homes. Another church had their senior group, called "Prime Timers", who want to "Foster a Foster Family" by providing their time, treasure, and talents for foster children and foster parents. When we say, "Everyone can do something", we mean, "Everyone can do something". Care Communities have not only made a difference in the lives of foster families but have created a lasting bond between the church and the families they serve.
